| <p>The abstract section is a concise and factual summary of the research. It should state briefly the purpose of the research, the principal results and major conclusions in 150- 250 words.</p> <p>SUMMARY (Structured) Background: Objective Materials and Methods: Results: Conclusions: Keywords:</p> | <p>In this section, authors should state the objectives of the work and provide a background without giving a detailed literature survey or summary of the results.</p> | <p>In this section, authors should present clear and concise results. This is important as it allows readers to quickly understand the main findings of the research without getting lost in unnecessary details.</p> |
| DISCUSSION | CONCLUSIONS | ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS |
| <p>The discussion section should explore the significance of the results, not repeat them. Citation and discussion of published literature should be avoided.</p> | <p>The conclusions section should present the main conclusions of the study. It should be presented in a short, standalone section. This section can also form a subsection of a Discussion or Results and Discussion section.</p> | <p>The acknowledgements section is a place to recognize and thank those who contributed to the research but do not meet the criteria for authorship. It should be collated in a separate section at the end of the article before the references.</p> |

| <p>The references section should be arranged according to the AMA Style.</p> <p>In AMA style, references are arranged numerically in the order in which they are cited in the text.</p> <p>More than one reference from the same author(s) in the same year must be identified by the letters: a, b, c... placed after the year of publication.</p> <p>Smith B, Boster K. Communication Techniques. Science. 1996; 2(2): 413-445.</p> <p>Brown L, Taylor P. Immune response to viral infection. In: Rich RR, ed. Clinical Immunology. Elsevier; 2019:215-228.</p> | <p>Tables in a document must be numbered with Arabic numerals, and the order should follow how they are cited in the text.</p> <p>The description titles should be placed at the top of the table, and footnotes should be included below it.</p> <p>Please note that any data already mentioned in the text cannot be replicated in the tables.</p> <p>Lastly, tables must be submitted in Microsoft Word and use A4 paper size.</p> | <p>Electronic versions of figures must be provided with the following resolutions:</p> <p>600 dots per inch (dpi) for line drawings and combinations</p> <p>300 dpi for greyscale and color.</p> <p>If you include color figures, make sure the files are in CMYK color mode, not RGB.</p> <p>Also, make sure that the electronic image files print at a readable size and are of high quality for publication.</p> |
